MESSAGES FROM ELDERS

IF YOU LOVE ME?

John 14:15 "If you love Me, you will keep My commandments" and read John 21:15 "¹⁵Now when they had finished breakfast, Jesus *said to Simon Peter, "Simon, *son* of John, do you love Me more than these?" He *said to Him, "Yes, Lord; You know that I love You." He *said to him, "Tend My lambs." ¹⁶ He *said to him again, a second time, "Simon, *son* of John, do you love Me?" He *said to Him, "Yes, Lord; You know that I love You." He *said to him, "Shepherd My sheep." ¹⁷ He *said to him the third time, "Simon, *son* of John, do you love Me?" Peter was hurt because He said to him the third time, "Do you love Me?" And he said to Him, "Lord, You know all things; You know that I love You." Jesus *said to him, "Tend My sheep."

With these verses in mind, Jesus asked Peter three times if Peter loved Him, each with a different form of love and response given. I wonder have we ever truly asked ourselves how much do we love Him? King David wrote so many Psalms to show his love and praise to God and yet had no idea what Jesus would do for us. I know we all are committed to Christ and try to live a moral life, but you can be obedient and not love. Do we tend and shepherd the sheep, love all the body or just certain ones? Jesus tells us if we can't love the ones we see, how can we love God who we can't see? Do you have a desire to



know Him? To seek Him in His word and to talk to Him in prayer? When you find yourself sinning, afterward, do you immediately mend the relationship by repentance and seeking to come back to Him? Look, I'm only posing these questions to you because in Revelations 2:4, to the church in Ephesus, Jesus had this against them, that they had left their first love. I encourage you to take a serious look at your own walk with the Lord and make any corrections needed to love Him with all your heart, soul, and mind. I have asked this of myself and that we should love, because he has first loved us. 1John 4:19. Dave

THREE FUNDAMENTAL TRUTHS: FROM HEBREW 10

- 1. Vs. 7 Then I said, Behold, I have come (In the scroll of the book it is written of Me) To do Your will, O God." The will of God is the source of the first fundamental truth.
- 2. Vs. 10 By this will we have been sanctified through, the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all. The work of Jesus was to abolish the law and do away with the cause of sin. This is the second fundamental truth the work of Christ.
- 3. Vs. 15 And the Holy Spirit also testifies to us; The Holy Spirit is our witness, and He is the Seal of our relationship to the Lord. This is the third fundamental truth.
